Forth Bridge - 10th Year UNESCO World Heritage Anniversary

On the 3rd July in the Forth Bridges Customer Education Centre (CEC) in South Queensferry, an exhibition of Forth Bridge artefacts followed by a number of talks on the Forth Bridge.








The first talk was from John Andrew - Transport Scotland, who gave us an in-depth view of the mammoth task of scaffolding and sand-blasting the Forth Bridge, and painting it with new North Sea technology paint that is said to last 25+ years, and by one estimate, up to 40 years!

Dr Miles Ogelthorpe, who retired from HES and Industrial Heritage is now President of TICCIH – The International Committee for the Conservation of Industrial Heritage.



He gave a talk celebrating the Forth Bridge and added many other industrial heritage sites throughout the world. Worthy of note, is that the successful management plan for the Forth Bridge has been adopted as an

exemplary document for new proposed sites across the world.

Miles enjoyed showing off the "Forth Bridge Bridgery" as an example of day-to-day use of the iconic bridge.



Miles was followed by Kenny McAlpine, from Network Rail, who



gave us an update on the ongoing maintenance and support plan for their one and only, Forth Bridge.

Occupations of Old - 23 Oct, 2025 Jackie Sangster

This talk will use archive photographs working lives explore professions from the past. Looking at iobs used to do. from we bus-conductors and onion Johnnies. switchboard operators lighthouse keepers. Technology and shifts in society have rendered many of these roles to history, so we shall look back and celebrate the people who served their communities in different ways.

Submarine Miners - 11 Nov, 2025 Boyd Wiliamson

Boyd will be presenting his research into the war-time activities at Port Laign Beach. During the first world wars it was the location of the Royal Naval Air Corp when it used the Forth to help develop aircraft carriers. In 1918 it was absorbed into the RAF. There was also a submarine mine manufacturing facility that some in the village remember either playing in the ruins or along the old railway lines going to the Gov'y Pier.

Above & Below the Forth - TBA Lloyd Blyth - e-Foil Scotland

Lloyd is a saturation diver, and spends a lot of his work under the sea at depth in the North Sea.

His "home" or on-shore work. is running e-Foil Scotland. а company based in Burntisland that teaches enthusiasts how to fly or cycle over water - today.



e-Foil is now the Leading eFoil School for Fife and Edinburgh.

Save the Albert - an update from ACG Ltd



For those of us who are concerned about the state of The Albert Hotel, here is an update:

The North Queensferry Community Trust submitted the second part of a Community Right to Buy Part 5 application in October 2023. The application was deemed valid and was categorised as 'Pending' on the Register of Applications by Community Bodies to Buy Land. After a delay of 17 months, the application was refused by the Scottish Ministers

the recommendation of the on Community Land Team. Notwithstanding the delay, prolonged by the requirement of time for a secret postal ballot before the application could be submitted, a period of only 28 days were allowed for an appeal via the Sheriff Civil Court. An appeal against the refusal has been started but the court hearing will not take place until September 2025.

An important consequence of the delays in the community right to buy process, is that the projected costs of renovating the neglected hotel have spiralled.
